Recent Workshop: Impressionistic Acrylic



What does impressionist painting mean?

A French 19th century art movement which marked a momentous break from tradition in European painting. Impressionist art is a style in which the artist captures the image of an object as someone would see it if they just caught a glimpse of it.

The movement gained its name after the hostile French critic Louis Leroy, reviewing the first major Impressionist exhibition of 1874, seized on the title of Claude Monet's painting *Impression, Sunrise* (1873), and accused the group of painting nothing but impressions.

The Impressionist painters like Monet, Renoir, and Matisse used very small overlapping brush strokes in their painting. They were the first artists to actually paint on location, using oil paints that did not dry for weeks.

This quick dry makes it the perfect style for beginners to try when they begin painting with acrylics. Bob Pennycook (pictured left) taught recent attendees this style.

Community Bulletin Board: Upcoming Event in Brighton

Unlike trafficking in drugs or weapons, human trafficking is a criminal activity that can be committed again and again with the same person, perpetuating the issue and having astronomical negative impacts on the victim and society as a whole.

Victims of human trafficking often do not come forward on their own for various reasons including fear for their lives or the lives of their loved ones, ideology of distrust of others, and not understanding that they are victims. This is why it is so important that all members of the community who may come into contact with potential victims are educated and aware of what human trafficking looks like, the signs of a person who is being trafficked, and the risk factors associated with this.

The goal of the Human Trafficking Response Committee is to decrease the number of victims of human trafficking through collaborative education, awareness and prevention initiatives within Northumberland County. The committee is going to meet that goal using the following objectives:

- To collaborate with key stakeholders and service providers to address human trafficking in this community, specifically toward the goal of identifying and supporting victims and preventing further victimization.
- To become informed of the evidence-based research supporting victims of Human Trafficking and provide the community with the knowledge and training necessary to identify victims at an earlier stage.
- To plan and coordinate educational activities for youth, given that they are the population most at risk.
- To produce a lasting strategy for collaboration in dealing with prevention of victimization due to human trafficking, to make the communities of Northumberland safer.

There are currently 10 different service providers sitting on the Human Trafficking Response Committee which includes a cross section of stakeholders, such as Cobourg and Port Hope Police Services, Cornerstone Family Violence Prevention Centre, Youth Probation Services, Rebound Child & Youth Services, Victim Services of Peterborough and Northumberland, and Highland Shores Children's Aid to name a few.

Human trafficking is a complex issue that requires a coordinated, collaborative approach to address it. The Human Trafficking Response Committee is dedicated to preventing victimization by providing a forum for all services to work collectively to address the issue, bringing it out of the shadows, so it can no longer flourish in the dark.
